#### SECTION 4: First aid measures

##### 4.1. Description of first aid measures

<b>Inhalation</b>	Remove person to fresh air and keep comfortable for breathing.
<b>Ingestion</b>	Rinse mouth thoroughly with water. Do not induce vomiting. Give a few small glasses of water or milk to drink. Keep affected person under observation. Get medical attention if any discomfort continues.
<b>Skin contact</b>	Remove contaminated clothing and rinse skin thoroughly with water. Get medical attention if symptoms are severe or persist after washing.

### 4.2. Most important symptoms and effects, both acute and delayed

**Inhalation** Irritating to respiratory system.

**Ingestion** Harmful if swallowed. May cause chemical burns in mouth, oesophagus and stomach.

**Skin contact** May cause serious chemical burns to the skin.

**Eye contact** Causes serious eye damage.
